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## 1 POLICY STATEMENT

Master Builders SA is committed to ensuring all staff are provided with a working environment that is free from unacceptable risks to health and safety. To achieve this outcome Master Builders SA will introduce a work health and safety (WHS) system which provides for:

- Identification and assessment of hazards and risks.
- Instruction and training, where applicable.
- Cooperation and coordination.
- Monitoring of the work environment.
- PPE, where applicable.

## 2 POLICY OBJECTIVES

The objectives of this policy are to ensure, so far as is reasonable practicable, that:

- Staff and other persons are protected against harm to their health and safety through the elimination or minimisation of risk arising from work.
- Safety systems of work, equipments and chemicals are provided.
- Effective consultation, coordinator and communication with other duty holders and staff in relation to workplace health and safety are established.
- Adequate information, instruction, training and supervision is provided for a safe and healthy workplace.
- WHS legislation and other relevant laws that relate to health and safety are complied with.
- Injured staff are provided with adequate injury management to enable them to remain at work or return to work at the earliest opportunity.
- Ongoing actions are developed to prevent incidents or their recurrence.

## 3 POLICY REVIEW

To ensure that the WHS system remains effective in providing a safe and health work environment, Master Builders SA WHS system will be review periodically. This review will focus on the effectiveness of individual elements of the system, the relevance of changes to Commonwealth and State WHS legislation which may have occurred, and any other matters which potentially impact on the system.
